Adam Lau, bass

American bass Adam Lau, praised as a "bass of real quality, with sonorous low notes," continues a busy and active career with multiple operatic and concert dates in the 2017-2018 season. He will appear with Wexford Festival Opera as Creon in *Medea*; as Basilio in *II Barbiere di Siviglia* with Kentucky Opera; and as the Old Hebrew in *Samson et Dalila* with North Carolina Opera. Concert appearances include the Mozart Requiem with the San Diego Symphony; Haydn's *Creation* with Symphony Silicon Valley; and in December, Händel's *Messiah* with Musica Sacra at Carnegie Hall.

Most recently, Mr. Lau sang in Verdi's *Requiem* with Guelph Symphony Orchestra, returned to Seattle Opera as The Speaker in *The Magic Flute*, and performed in the Mahler 8th Symphony with Maestro Kent Tritle and the Berkshire Music Festival. Last summer, he made his debut with the Minnesota Orchestra, singing the role of Lodovico in their concert performance of *Otello*. He also returned to the San Francisco Symphony for Beethoven's 9th Symphony, having debuted with that orchestra in 2015 with *Messiah*.

Other highlights of Mr. Lau's 2016-17 season included his first Wagnerian role, that of Donner in *Das Rheingold*, in a return to North Carolina Opera. He made his debut with Lyric Opera of Kansas City, singing the title role in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, followed by his Carnegie Hall debut *Messiah* with The Oratorio Society of NY. In the Spring of 2017, Mr. Lau returned to Carnegie Hall to sing Pilate in Bach's *St. John Passion* with Master Voices. He also made his international debut singing Méphistophélès in *The Damnation of Faust* with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic, conducted by John Nelson. Mr. Lau's 2015-2016 season marked his first appearance with the San Francisco Symphony, as the bass soloist in *Messiah*, as well as performances with North Carolina Opera as Don Basilio in *Barbiere*.

In the 2014-15 season, Mr. Lau made debuts with several important opera companies: North Carolina Opera (as Leporello in *Don Giovanni*) and Opera Theater of St. Louis, as Berardo in the American Premiere of Handel's *Riccardo Primo*. In February 2015 he sang the role of Don Alfonso in *Così fan tutte* for Opera Naples in Florida.

Adam Lau won First Prize in the 2016 Jensen Vocal Competition, and Top Prize in the 2015 George London Foundation competition. He was also a finalist in the 2016 Dallas Opera Competition. He has appeared with some of the nation's leading summer festivals including Merola Opera Center, Aspen Opera Theater Center, and Santa Fe Opera.
